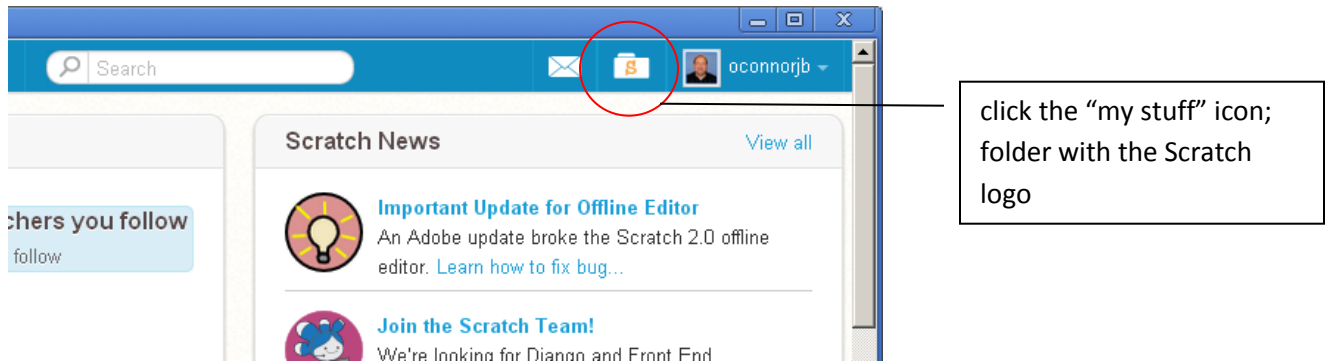
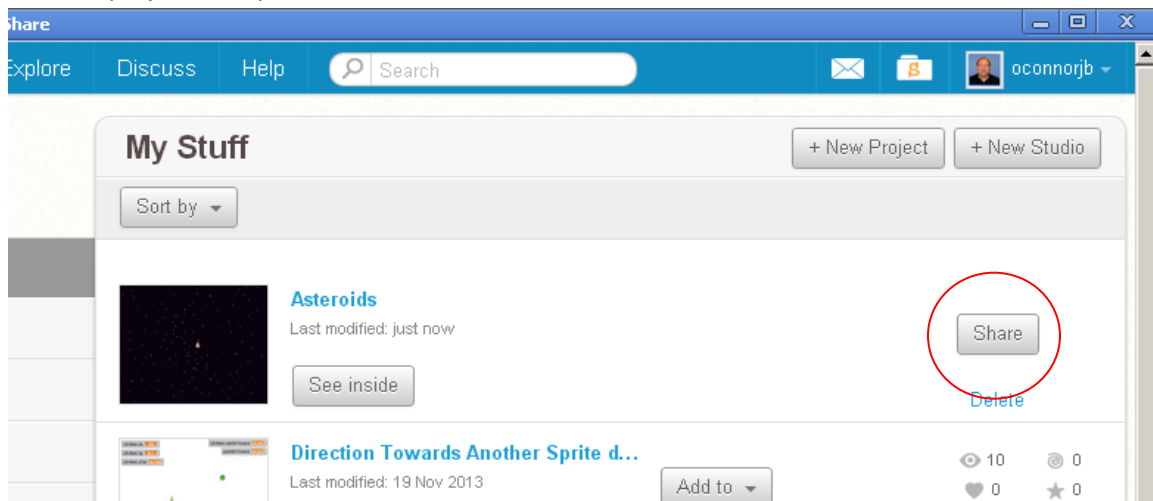


Sharing a Scratch 2.0 project and sending a link to your teacher

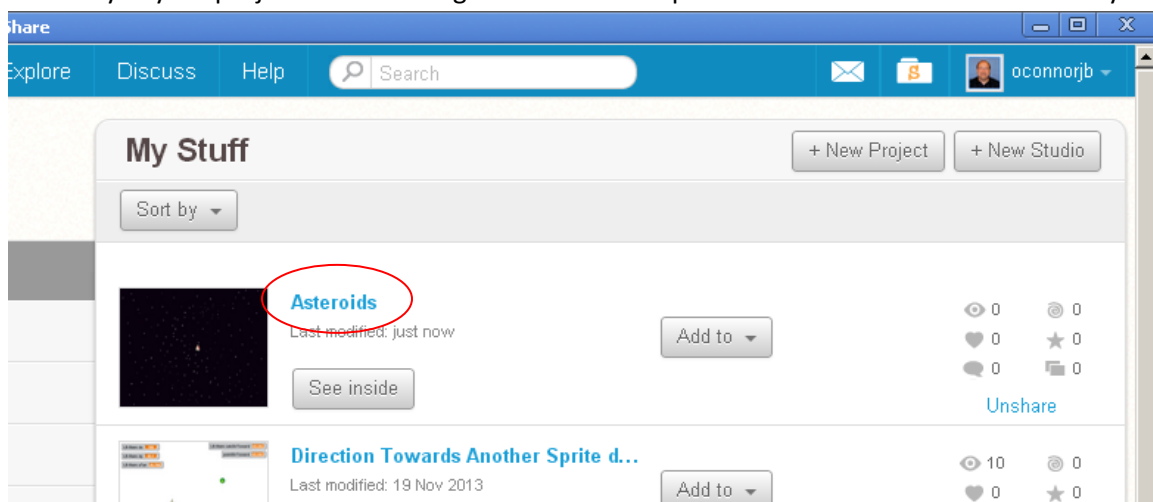
1. Log in to Scratch 2.0 (<http://scratch.mit.edu>) and click on the “my stuff” icon to the left of your username:



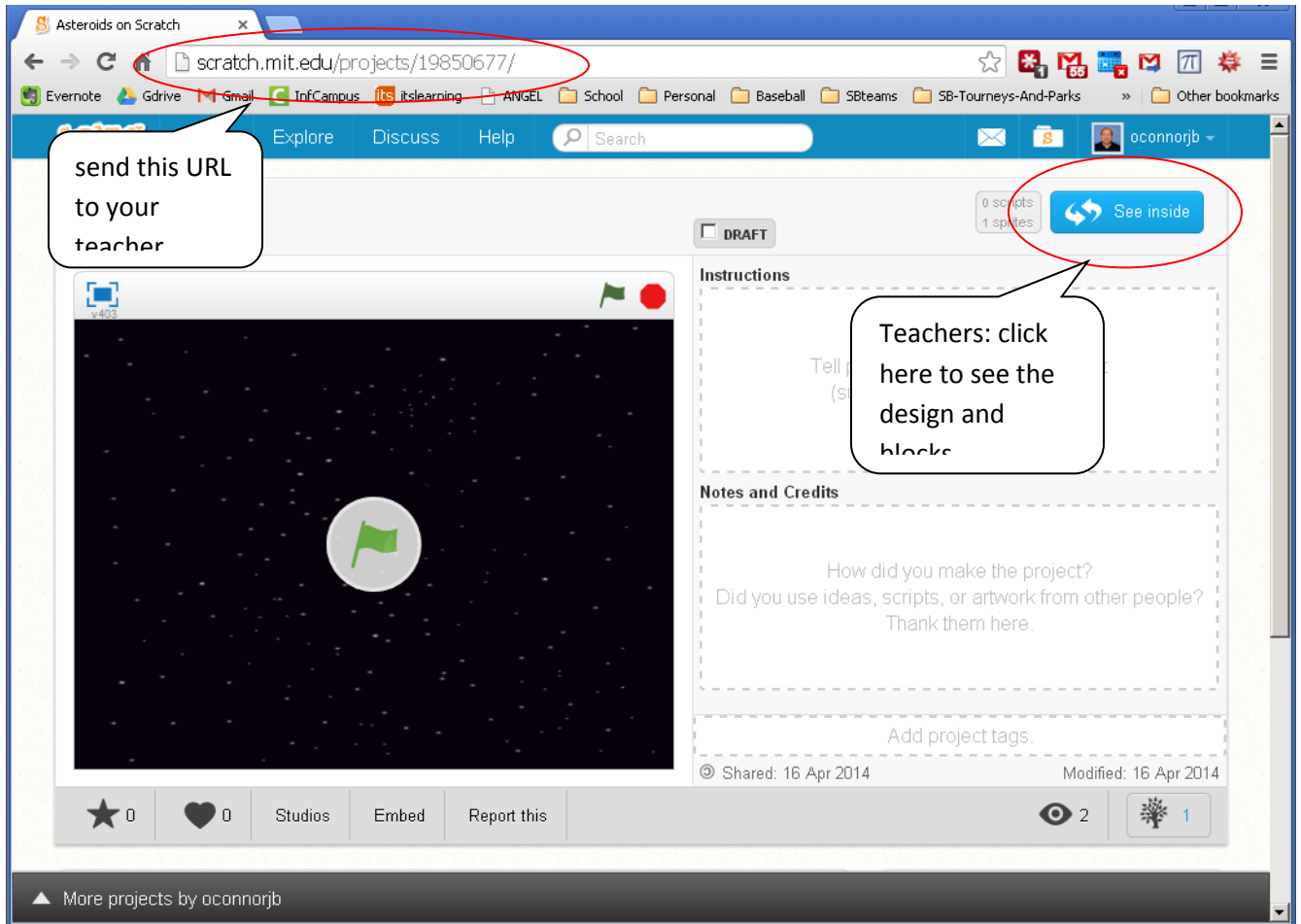
2. Find the project that you need to share and click the “Share” button:



3. The entry in your project list will change to look like the picture below. Click on the name of your project:



4. The project will open in “Play” mode and look like the picture below. Highlight and copy the URL that appears in the address bar of your browser. That is the link that you need to send to your teacher.



When your teacher receives the link, he/she will be able to see your Instructions and Notes/Credits, and click on the “See Inside” button to open the “editor” mode and see your design and blocks. Your teacher (or anyone else) will NOT be able to make changes to your project.

The “Modified Date” of a project does show on the screen above, so if your work had to be completed by a specific due date, then be sure to “Share” your project on or before the due date, and don’t make any changes to it afterward (talk to your teacher about specific requirements).

If you want to continue working on modifications while a version submitted for grading sits untouched, before



you “Share”, while in the “editor” mode, click on “File” and “Save as a copy” to make a new copy:
